

- 1. In two months Peter will be able to say what is disturbing him and he will be able to ask them to stop their upsetting behavior in an appropriate way. If this doesn't work, he will ask the teacher for help.**
- 2. In three months John will be capable of preparing for an exam alone using the roadmap 'learning for an exam'.**
- 3. After Christmas Jonathan will be able to work by himself for 35 minutes. After the 35 minutes he will write down what he has done on a schedule.**
- 4. In two weeks Gary will start his work directly after the break.**
- 5. In four weeks Marc will be able to work nicely and quietly on his own by using a route planner.**
- 6. In two months Karen will not use dirty words in the classroom any more.**
- 7. In six weeks Michael will take off his baseball-hat and coat, will unpack his bag and will put his mobile in the mobile corner.**

- 8. In one week Malcolm will understand that he cannot just go out of the classroom to cool down without clarifying and asking the teacher for permission.**
- 9. In four weeks Victor will be able to give input into the pc about what happened in a fight with classroom peer(s). He will be able to formulate what he did in the incident and what the other student(s) did.**
- 10. Tim's problem is that he is not able to concentrate on his work. He is thinking a lot about other things, often in a negative way which is not relevant for the task. In four weeks he will write down his thoughts during class and it will be read by the teacher immediately. Then Tim will continue his work.**
- 11. Vicki will work in a systematic, self-directed way in her books in 2 months. She will write down the tasks she doesn't understand to talk with her teacher later that week.**
